**Subject:** Request for a Meeting: The Legislature's Constitutional & Statutory Duty to Reject the Judiciary's Proposed Budget for Fiscal Year 2014-2015

**TO: Burton Phillips, Policy Director to Senator Brad Hoylman** 

Thank you for the opportunity you gave me yesterday to summarize the Center for Judicial Accountability's December 11<sup>th</sup> letter – to which Senator Hoylman is an indicated recipient as Ranking Member of the Senate Committee on Investigations and Government Operations. The letter identifies (at pp. 8-9) that I would be scheduling a meeting with Senator Hoylman, as likewise with Senator Marcellino, as Chair of the Senate Committee on Investigations and Government Operations -- and with Assemblyman Hevesi and Assemblyman Montesano, the respective Chair and Ranking Member of the Assembly Committee on Oversight, Analysis and Investigation – to discuss with them "whether they are able to meaningfully comprehend and scrutinize the Judiciary's purported 'itemized estimates', budget bill, and the concealed, but included, third-phase of the judicial salary increase". That Senator Hoylman is <u>also</u> a member of the Senate Indiciary's larcenous, slush-fund budget.

For that purpose – and also to discuss CJA's related June 4, 2013 letter, which was addressed <u>directly</u> to the Senate Committee on Investigations and Government Operations and to the Assembly Committee on Oversight, Analysis and Investigation – I am requesting to meet with Senator Hoylman <u>at his earliest convenience</u>, either in Albany or at his district office – and either individually or with his three fellow committee leaders.
