On Friday, July 16<sup>th</sup>, I timely served & transmitted my motion for remand, reconsideration, renewal, and other relief. Paragraph 4 stated that the continuation/conclusion of my affidavit would be transmitted today, Monday, July 19<sup>th</sup>.

Please be advised that due to the complete absence of all library resources, as well as other handicaps resulting from my incarceration, I have been unable to capture the concluding portion of my affidavit. It will be sent later this week.

Meanwhile, the US Attorney can profitably use the time to address the particularized facts and "clear and convincing evidence" presented by my motion as already sent to him.
