CJA's March 3, 2000 facially-meritorious judicial misconduct complaint and the Commission on Judicial Conduct's March 7, 2000 and April 6, 2000 letters of acknowledgment and dismissal are annexed as Exhibits "C-1", "C-2", and "C-3", respectively, to CJA's April 18,

- (3) CJA's April 24, 2000 letter to Robert M. Morgenthau, District Attorney/New York County, pertaining to CJA's unresponded-to March 17, 2000 letter requesting supervisory review of the official misconduct of Thomas Wornam, Deputy Chief of the Special Prosecutions Bureau in connection with his handling of CJA's October 21, 1999 criminal complaint and intervention request;
- (4) CJA's April 24, 2000 letter to Mary Jo White, U.S. Attorney/Southern District of New York, pertaining to CJA's unresponded-to March 17, 2000 letter requesting supervisory review of the official misconduct of Andrew Dember, Chief of the Public Corruption Unit in connection with his handling of CJA's October 21, 1999 criminal complaint;
- (5) CJA's April 24, 2000 letter to Loretta E. Lynch, U.S. Attorney/Eastern District of New York, pertaining to CJA's unresponded-to March 17, 2000 letter requesting supervisory review of the official misconduct of Andrew Weissmann, Deputy Chief of the Criminal Division in connection with his handling of CJA's September 7, 1999 criminal complaint.

By this transmittal memorandum, CJA reiterates its demand, set forth in its March 17, 2000 transmittal memorandum (at pp. 2-3), that you meet your duty to ensure governmental integrity by:

- (a) referring for investigation CJA's uninvestigated criminal and ethics complaints to the Public Integrity Section of the U.S. Justice Department's Criminal Division; and/or
- (b) joining in CJA's requests to Chief Judge Kaye for appointment of a Special Inspector General and to Governor Pataki for appointment of a Special Investigator or investigative commission.
