Subject: Is U.S. Attorney Bharara investigating the corruption of the Commission to Investigate Public Corruption?

How to explain U.S. Attorney Bharara's succession of preservation letters and subpoenas over the past four weeks – about which you have written.

Perhaps it is the notice that the Center for Judicial Accountability, Inc. (CJA) gave U.S. Attorney Bharara more than six weeks ago that the Commission was itself corrupt – thereafter furnishing him with a particularized recitation set forth in lawsuit papers: my April 23, 2014 order to show cause to intervene in the Legislature's declaratory judgment action against the Commission, *NYS Senate, et al. v. Rice, et al.* (NY Co. #160941/13). The recitation provides the scandalous FACTS about the Commission's origin and operations, as yet unreported by the press – as likewise about the declaratory judgment action.
