Dear Mr. Hoffman:

This letter is to thank both you and Mr. Beaupre for meeting with me yesterday to discuss the findings of Ninth Judicial Committee's six-month investigation of Mr. O'Rourke's judicial qualifications.

Much as I anticipated, I was not in a position to answer important questions raised by you and Mr. Beaupre--particularly as to the <u>Surlak</u> case, detailed at pp. 7-16 of our critique.

Since that case is particularly <u>critical</u> to your assessment of Mr. O'Rourke's legal background--as well as the <u>pattern</u> of falsification, distortion and omission of material facts which characterizes his presentation to the Senate Judiciary Committee--may I again suggest that you avail yourselves of the opportunity to speak directly with our Director, Doris Sassower, who personally reviewed the files in that case, as well as interviewed Mr. Surlak himself and conferred with his attorney, Anthony Burton, Esq.

Doris Sassower's legal expertise and background in judicial selection criteria are set forth in the <u>Profile</u> immediately following page 48 of the critique. She is quite willing to speak with you and Mr. Beaupre, either by phone or in person.
