I will not inundate you all at once with our correspondence directed to other parties—except to say that it further demonstrates and expands upon the "dereliction of all involved", which was the second finding of our critique (at p. 2).

In that connection, may I point out the result of a <u>U.S. News and World Report</u> poll (10/12/92 issue, p. 36 enclosed) in answer to the question: "Which Is the Single Most Important Lesson Learned from the Hill/Thomas Controversy?" Twenty percent (20%) of the survey responded: "The Way the Senate Confirmation Process Should Be Reformed".

There is an important "untold story" as to the failure of the Senate to actually follow-up with meaningful reform--a story highlighted by its response (or lack thereof) to the documented showing presented by our critique, summarized in our May 19th letter to Senate Majority Leader Mitchell.

Looking forward to working with you on this major news story affecting the public interest.
