SASSOWER: Just give me one 11 moment, please. 12 SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: Well, before 13 you start, I'd like to remind you that the 14 purpose of this hearing is to pass on the 15 qualifications of Judge Read. 16 17 MS. SASSOWER: Absolutely. SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: Okay. 18 19 MS. SASSOWER: Chairman DeFrancisco, Committee Members, Judge Read, good morning. 20 My name is Elena Ruth Sassower and I'm the 21 coordinator and cofounder of the Center for 22 Judicial Accountability, a nonpartisan, 23

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nonprofit, citizens' organization dedicated

| 15 | SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: The point is |

Governor Pataki's appointment of Court of Claims Presiding Judge Susan P. Read to the New York Court of Appeals. The basis for such opposition is twofold.

One: Judge Read's appointment is the product of a corrupted merit selection process such that her appointment is not even properly before this Committee as a matter of law; and, two, Judge Read's official misconduct as Governor Pataki's deputy counsel.

These grounds of opposition were identified to the Senate Judiciary Committee in advance of this hearing including by letters to Chairman DeFrancisco dated and faxed January 14th and January 17th as to which there has been no investigative response including no inquiry by Committee counsel.

Consequently, this Committee's duty
upon conclusion of my testimony is to call
upon Judge Read to publicly respond
including as to whether she would not agree
that any vote on her confirmation must

properly be deferred until the Committee 7 2 examines the substantiating documentation on which this opposition is based. 3 4 The Center for Judicial Accountability, 5 CJA's January 17th letter to Chairman 6 DeFrancisco objected to this hearing as 7 premature and requested that it be 8 postponed. 9 As stated therein, Judge Read --10 SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: Excuse me, Ms. 11 Sassower. I don't want to be impolite. 12 gave you the opportunity to speak. 13 going to say it one last time. The issue is on the confirmation of one individual. 14 15 MS. SASSOWER: That's right. 16 SENATOR DEFRANCISCO: It is not 17 concerning the procedures of the Office of Court Administration, the governor, the 18 19 Senate Judiciary Committee or any other committee. That is not before us today. 20 21 Now, if you want to raise an issue 22 concerning the qualifications of this individual, you're free to do so. 23 24 MS. SASSOWER: Chairman DeFrancisco,
