TO: COMMISSION TO INVESTIGATE PUBLIC CORRUPTION

According to a September 30th Daily News article by Ken Lovett, "Gov. Cuomo Grabs Greater Control Of Anti-Corruption Commission: Multiple Sources":

"<u>By law</u>, the panel created by Cuomo under the Moreland Act is <u>required</u> to report to the governor and attorney general--who deputized the commission's 25 members--on a weekly basis." (underlining added).

Please advise what "law" imposes such weekly reporting requirement – as it certainly is <u>not</u> in Executive Order #106, which established the Commission to Investigate Public Corruption.

To the extent that this alleged "require[ment]" is part of the "procedures and rules" unanimously promulgated by the Commission's co-chairs pursuant to Sec. V of Executive Order #106, we hereby reiterate our request for such "procedures and rules", made by our August 5th letter to the Commission, without response – and so-identified by me when I testified at the Commission's September 17th hearing in Manhattan: http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=OZ4CpWkOLlc&feature=youtu.be.
