This is to alert you to the GOOD NEWS – which New York's "fake news"/election-rigging journalism has been concealing. You can win election easily and without money against Brooklyn's re-election-seeking legislative incumbents. All it requires is using the "bully-pulpit" of your candidacy to whistle-blow about the above-attached FULLY-DOCUMENTED public corruption/grand jury complaint against them, which Brooklyn District Attorney Eric Gonzalez has been "sitting on". The complaint establishes, with EVIDENCE, that they must be indicted on EVIDENCE so *prima facie* and open-and-shut as to assure convictions.

New York's press has known about the complaints for quite some time – and illustrative is the below September 21<sup>st</sup> e-mail to The New York Times and other New York press, to which Brooklyn's 21 re-election-seeking legislative incumbents and D.A. Gonzalez were cc'd so that they could be ready for press inquiries. Individually and collectively, if you stand up for honest, accountable government and make the complaints your campaign issue, you will win – easily. Demand that the complained-against legislators respond to the complaint, that D.A. Gonzalez explain he has not presented it to a Brooklyn grand jury, and that the press do its part to investigate and report.

So that the unopposed non-incumbent candidates for Brooklyn legislative seats can help you – such as Emily Gallagher who has known about what has been going on since before her primary win, ousting Assemblyman Lentol, and unopposed candidate Marcela Mitaynes, to whom I also reached out, supplying both with the above-attached June 9<sup>th</sup> public corruption/grand jury complaint, and, additionally, unopposed Stefani Zineraman, I am cc'ing them on this e-mail

so that they can show the kind of fidelity to truth and the public interest that will be constitutionally required of them as legislators.

I am available to answer your questions – and invite you to call. Needless to say, voters are entitled to know from future assemblywomen Gallagher, Mitaynes, and Souffrant what salary they expect to be paid upon their election to the Legislature – and whether they commit to ensuring: (1) public findings of fact and conclusions of law with respect to the complaint; (2) prosecution of all culpable public officers and their conspirators; and (3) “claw-backs” to recover the approximately half-a-billion dollars in fraudulent salary increases, already paid out. By this e-mail, I ask that they so advise – indeed, that they call me, so that we can speak directly. I also request answers to the same from the other candidates.

Finally, I ask your help in forwarding this e-mail to the above-listed eight candidates whose names are preceded by an asterisk (\*), as I was unable to find e-mail addresses for them, including because, with one exception, they apparently have neither campaign websites or facebook pages.
