Dear Mr. Lieberman,

I here file a disciplinary complaint against ANDRAL N. BRATTON, Esq. ["Bratton"], and would appreciate a prompt acknowledgment.

1a. Mr. Bratton, both as an investigator and prosecutor, knew and/or had every reason to believe, that SAM POLUR, Esq. ["Polur"] never served any summons on DONALD F. SCHNEIDER, Esq. ["Schneider"] on April 10, 1985, and certainly Exhibit "H" was not that summons.

b. Had Mr. Bratton has any interest in the truth, rather than conspiring with Schneider, in order to advance and conceal a criminal racketeering adventure, he would have subpoenaed or telephoned me, and he would have had the documented, uncontroverted, facts.

2. In almost every other respect, Mr. Bratton's assertions against Mr. Polur insofar as it related to Puccini, was concocted, fabricated and contrived, as I can easily demonstrate from the transcript of the hearings, although I only partially examined same.

3a. Since I contend that your Committee is disqualified from adjudicating this matter against Mr. Bratton, I will leave further details to the appropriate tribunal to which this matter might be referred.

b. In my view, the appropriate tribunal, would be the grand jury, with incarceration as the end product.
