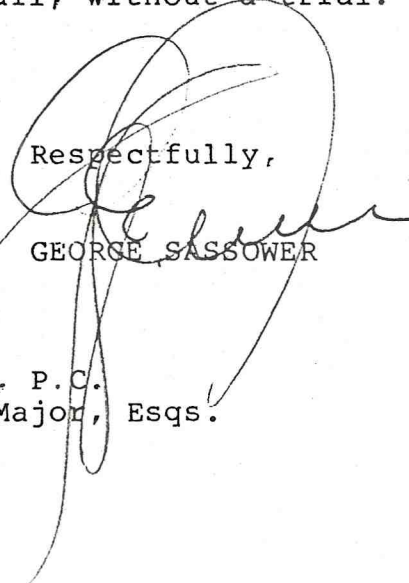
Honorable Sir:

On this day, ten (10) days after the return date of the aforementioned motion and more than two and one-half months after it was made, I received the opposing affidavit of Senior Assistant Attorney General David S. Cook, Esq.

Mr. Cook's affidavits and briefs are invariably late by a very substantial degree, as here, and prejudicial, since response is physically precluded.

Until this Court shows a willingness to impose substantial penal costs for such persistent prejudicial practices by Mr. Cook, adversary litigants will justly believe that judicial rules may be disobeyed by some, others go to jail, without a trial.
