RE: Not Accessible to the Public: (1) The Videos of the Commission on Judicial Compensation's Hearing & Meetings; (2) the Commission's "Final Report"; and (3) "All of the comments and submissions" Received by the Commission, Including CJA's August 17, 2011 Letter Entitled "Protecting the People of this State From Fraud..."

Dear Ms. Sherwin:

This follows our August 26<sup>th</sup> conversation about the Commission on Judicial Compensation's website, [www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov](http://www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov), in the lobby of the Office of Court Administration, after the Commission's meeting.

The problem I reported to you last week remains unchanged. When I try to access the videos of the Commission's July 20<sup>th</sup> hearing and of its August 8<sup>th</sup> meeting, which the Commission moved to an "Archive" webpage on August 25<sup>th</sup>, they do NOT play. Instead, the following appears:

"Windows Media Player cannot find the file. If you are trying to play, burn, or sync an item that is in your library, the item might point to a file that has been moved, renamed, or deleted."

Indeed, that is what also appears when I try to access the video for the Commission's August 26<sup>th</sup> meeting.

Additionally, there remains no video link for the Commission's July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting. Although you told me that the company which telecast the July 11<sup>th</sup> meeting did not make a video, perhaps the company's telecast was recorded by someone else. Have you checked with the Office of Court Administration, including its press office, as to whether it recorded the telecast?

Also, the Commission's homepage link to its "Final Report", which initially did work, is no longer operational. Only the five "Appendix" documents to the "Final Report" are accessible.

Part of the now inaccessible "Final Report" is the Commission's August 29<sup>th</sup> letter to the Governor, Temporary Senate President, Assembly Speaker, and Chief Judge. It states:

"All of the comments and submissions that have been received by the Commission may be found on the Commission's website, [www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov](http://www.judicialcompensation.ny.gov)."

However, this is NOT the case. Indeed, when we spoke together on August 26<sup>th</sup>, I discussed with you submissions that had NOT been posted on the Commission's "Submissions" webpage – among these, CJA's August 17<sup>th</sup> letter to the Commission. You agreed that the August 17<sup>th</sup> letter should have been posted – and, for your convenience, on August 29<sup>th</sup>, I resent it to you for posting. Yet, the August 17<sup>th</sup> letter, entitled:


