Play Ball: Former baseball slugger Barry Bonds' trial on perjury charges is set to begin today in San Francisco federal district court. The New York Times writes about Bonds' all-star team of defense lawyers, including Allen Ruby, Cris Arguedas and Dennis Riordan.

Weathering The Storm: A <u>double-digit decline</u> in the number of new filings in U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York helped the court grapple with a substantial number of judicial vacancies, *The New York Law Journal* reports. The number of new cases filed dropped by nearly 12 percent.

Veteran v. Rookie: Caitlin Halligan, general counsel for the New York district attorney, is <u>expected today to argue in the U.S. Supreme Court</u> in a case about whether evidence from an unlawful police stop must be suppressed. Kristina Schwarz, a lawyer for The Legal Aid Society who has not argued previously in the high court, represents the defendant. Last month, *The National Law Journal* reported that <u>Republicans appeared skeptical</u> about the nomination of Halligan for a slot on the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit.

Purchased: AT&T Inc. on Sunday <u>announced a \$39 billion cash and stock deal</u> to buy T-Mobile USA from Deutsche Telekom, combining the second and fourth largest wireless carriers, *The Wall Street Journal* reported. It's unclear whether regulators will approve shrinking the number of national wireless operators in the United States from four to three. *The New York Times* reported that AT&T <u>would add 33.7 million customers</u> in the deal.
