Awaiting the Court's ruling on plaintiffs' December 19, 2025 affidavit demonstrating subject matter jurisdiction – & extending their time to effect service on the 34 defendants

It is now more than two months since plaintiffs filed their December 19, 2025 affidavit demonstrating subject matter jurisdiction, in response to the Court's November 13th sua sponte Order to Show Cause and December 5th Order, without a ruling by the Court.

As a result, and with no response from the Court to plaintiffs' requests, by their November 19th, December 5th, and December 10th letters:

“for an extension of plaintiffs' time to serve their verified amended complaint upon defendants from January 6, 2026 to 30 days from the date of the Court's decision on plaintiffs' show cause submission”,

none of the 34 defendants have been served and the case is at a standstill, notwithstanding the Court's January 23, 2026 Order granting *pro hac vice* admission to plaintiff CJA's attorney, Gary Zerman, Esq.

Meanwhile, defendants' *knowingly* false, “fake news”, corruption-abetting, election-rigging journalism, destroying constitutional, lawful governance in New York State – the subject of plaintiffs' October 29, 2025 verified amended complaint, refiled on January 5, 2026, with Mr. Zerman's signature — is continuing, unabated, now with respect to the FY2026-27 state budget and the 2026 elections for governor, lieutenant governor, attorney general, comptroller, all 213 state legislative seats, and for district attorney in roughly a dozen and a half counties throughout the state.


The Court's expedition is urgently required and respectfully requested.


