From your quoted comments in yesterday's <u>Post-Star</u> article "<u>Legislators say state budget may still be on time, but may be bare bones</u>" by Michael Goot, it appears you are unaware of how EASY it is to simplify the policy-packed NYS budget during this coronavirus emergency – and your role in achieving it.
