This follows up the voice mail message I left for you at about 10:40 am yesterday (315-412-1992), to which I have received no return call. I tried to reach you about an hour and a half ago, but your voice mail is full and was "unable to accept new messages".

I have a great deal of information and EVIDENCE to furnish you, germane to your reporting, as Mark Weiner can attest from my two phone lengthy conversations with him on March 16<sup>th</sup> and April 9th and his examination of CJA's website, <u>www.judgewatch.org</u>, including, as guided by me. A propos of your April 5<sup>th</sup> article on Cynthia Nixon's Syracuse visit, below is my March 29<sup>th</sup> e-mail to the members of the Legislative Correspondents' Association entitled "CORRUPTION ALERT: Does Albany 'Outsider' Cynthia Nixon think the 'three/four men in a room' budget deal-making, happening now & behind-closed-doors, is constitutional? How about The New York Times?" – simultaneously sent to Ms. Nixon's campaign treasurer, Zephyr Teachout. As reflected by the below transmittals to Mr. Weiner, I forwarded it to him on March 29<sup>th</sup> and then again on April 9<sup>th</sup>. The attachments are above.

I received no response from Professor Teachout – nor even confirmation that she furnished my correspondence to Ms. Nixon, as I had requested. Why is that? And what is her response to the lawsuit EVIDENCE that the New York State
