## TO: Julie McMahon/Syracuse Post-Standard -- "public affairs reporter", covering "courts, government and other issues affecting taxpayers"

This follows up the voice mail message I left for you at about 10:40 am yesterday (315-412-1992), to which I have received no return call. I tried to reach you about an hour and a half ago, but your voice mail is full and was "unable to accept new messages".

I have a great deal of information and EVIDENCE to furnish you, germane to your reporting, as Mark Weiner can attest from my two phone lengthy conversations with him on March 16<sup>th</sup> and April 9th and his examination of CJA's website, <u>www.judgewatch.org</u>, including, as guided by me. A propos of your April 5<sup>th</sup> article on Cynthia Nixon's Syracuse visit, below is my March 29<sup>th</sup> e-mail to the members of the Legislative Correspondents' Association entitled "CORRUPTION ALERT: Does Albany 'Outsider' Cynthia Nixon think the 'three/four men in a room' budget deal-making, happening now & behind-closed-doors, is constitutional? How about The New York Times?" – simultaneously sent to Ms. Nixon's campaign treasurer, Zephyr Teachout. As reflected by the below transmittals to Mr. Weiner, I forwarded it to him on March 29<sup>th</sup> and then again on April 9<sup>th</sup>. The attachments are above.

I received no response from Professor Teachout – nor even confirmation that she furnished my correspondence to Ms. Nixon, as I had requested. Why is that? And what is her response to the lawsuit EVIDENCE that the New York State budget is "off the constitutional rails" and a "grand larceny" of taxpayer monies for which Governor Cuomo, Attorney General Schneiderman, Comptroller DiNapoli and legislative incumbents cannot be re-elected – or, in Senator DeFrancisco's case, elected as governor -- because they must be indicted for corruption. As a purported "outsider", speaking truth to power, why hasn't Ms. Nixon "blown the whistle" – or even seen fit to call me, one of the ordinary people she purports to want to hear from, so that I could directly explain to her what has been going on, including <u>as</u> <u>testified by me, before the Legislature, at its January 30, 2018 and February 5, 2018 budget hearings</u> and embodied in a criminal complaint against Governor Cuomo, *et al*, that I filed with the Albany County district attorney on March 6, 2018: http://www.judgewatch.org/web-pages/searching-nys/2018-legislature/enforcing-public-trust-act.htm.

When I spoke with Mr. Weiner on Monday, I told him I would be contacting you and other <u>Syracuse Post-Standard</u> reporters, as well as the editorial board. Yesterday and today, I left voice mail messages for Patrick Lohmann (315-470-3016), the <u>Post-Standard</u>'s "New York state government reporter", who, as a member of the Legislative Correspondents' Association, was a recipient of my March 29<sup>th</sup> e-mail and prior e-mails. As yet, I have received no return call from him and am cc'ing him, with a request that he call me, at his earliest convenience. I am also cc'ing Chris Baker, the <u>Post-Standard</u>'s "public policy reporter", who has written several articles about candidates seeking nominations for legislative seats – including Senator DeFrancisco's 50<sup>th</sup> Senate district seat. I was unable to find a phone number for him and would also appreciate if he would call me, as well. Indeed, I commend you and Mr. Weiner for including your phone numbers at the end your articles, preceded by the inviting words that you "can be reached anytime". I look forward to hearing from you, as soon as possible – and trust that Mr. Weiner, who is based in Washington and busy with D.C. stories, will encourage you in that regard and, likewise, Messrs. Lohmann and Baker.
