I read with interest your article "Virus exposes the need for hospital beds after years of reductions", discussing the commission appointed by Governor Pataki and the Legislature, to reduce "excess" hospital capacity. You state:

"In Albany, the issue was so politically dicey that the Legislature and Pataki authorized the commission's recommendations to have the force of law, without a public vote by elected officials."

At least 7 lawsuits challenged the commission's closure/downsizing recommendations, including 2 lawsuits that went up to the Court of Appeals. The Court denied review in both cases, both by right and by leave — and its flagrant betrayal of its constitutional duties — motivated by its desire for judicial pay raises utilizing a comparable "force of law" commission scheme — is laid out at pages 9-15 of CJA's attached March 26, 2019 letter to the Court of Appeals in support of an appeal of right for the CJA v. Cuomo citizen-taxpayer action challenging the budget statute that had established "force of law" Commission on Legislative, Judicial and Executive Compensation (see, in particular, fn. 4).
