The duty of the Wyoming County D.A. is to enforce New York's penal laws and obey conflict of interest protocols. That is the subject of the Center for Judicial Accountability's above-attached and here-linked [July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint](#) to [Wyoming County Acting D.A. Vincent Hemming](#), sent to him by the below e-mail. It involves his \$221,100 D.A. salary, statutorily-tied to the Wyoming county court judge salary. Of this, \$101,300 is the product of three "false instrument", penal law-violating commission reports that Wyoming County's three state legislators, two running for re-election, are knowledgeable of and complicit in.

Acting D.A. Hemming, who assumed his position because [Wyoming D.A. Donald O'Geen was elected Wyoming county court judge](#) last November, in an uncontested election, is now himself running in an uncontested election to be D.A. He did not respond to the July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint, requesting his response by August 1st to two simple questions:

- (1) whether he would be repudiating the \$101,300 salary difference and advising Wyoming County to secure a judicial declaration voiding the three "false instrument", penal law-violating commission reports?;
- (2) whether he would be recusing himself from the July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint and securing an independent prosecutor?

Surely, Acting D.A. Hemming will be more responsive to inquiries from WXXI – and I am cc'ing him on this e-mail so that he can be fully prepared.

What does he have to say about the \$221,100 Wyoming County D.A. salary – and about Wayne County's state legislators whose public corruption is prioritized by the July 18, 2024 grand jury/public corruption complaint (at pp. 2-4). Will he disclose his political, professional, and personal relationships with them – and with the other public officers complained-against and implicated by the grand jury/public corruption complaint?

And can Acting D.A. Hemming explain how it is possible that notwithstanding [Wyoming County has a population of 40,338 and median household income of \\$65,066](#) and [state legislative salaries are \\$142,000, the highest in the nation](#), on top of which, as with D.A. salaries, are many thousands of dollars more in non-salary compensation benefits:

- [Senator George Borrello \(SD57\)](#) is uncontested for re-election and is running on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for either line;
- [Assemblyman David DiPietro \(AD147\)](#) is running for re-election on both Republican and Conservative lines for which he faced no primaries for the Conservative line, but only for the Republican line, against a single candidate. [Darci Cramer](#) is running against him on the Democratic line for which she faced no primaries for that line;
- The two candidates vying for election to the seat of retiring [Assemblywoman Marjorie Byrnes, Esq. \(AD133\)](#) are [Andrea Bailey](#), running on both Republican and Conservative lines for which she faced no primaries for either line, and [Colleen Walsch-Williams](#), running on the Democratic line for which she faced no primaries for that line.

Indeed, can Acting D.A. Hemming explain how it is possible that he is uncontested for election on the Republican line for which he faced no primaries?

I look forward to discussing with you the above questions and assisting your investigative journalism about Wyoming County's D.A. race, three state legislative races, and judicial races from supreme court to city court – all involving “false instrument”, penal law-violating salaries for these offices.
