JAY T. WEINSTEIN, being duly sworn, deposes and says:

- 1. I am an Assistant Attorney General in the Office of DENNIS C. VACCO, Attorney General of the State of New York, Attorney for Appellees in the above-captioned appeal.
- 2. Appellees request that their deadline for filing their brief be extended by three weeks, from February 18, 1997 to March 11, 1997. An extension of time is necessary to oppose the issues raised in Appellant's oversized seventy-six page brief. Considering that Appellant's time to file her brief was extended on numerous occasions for a total of nearly five months, fairness compels that Appellee's request for a three-week extension be granted.
- 2. By Civil Appeals Scheduling Order #1, dated July 18, 1996, Appellant Sassower's brief and appendix was ordered to be filed on or before August 19, 1996.
- 3. By Notice of Motion dated August 1, 1996, Appellant moved to supplement the record, for a 90-day extension of time to file her brief after the record was supplemented, and to make

further motions.

- 4. By Order dated September 17, 1996, Appellant's motion was granted to the extent that the record on appeal was to be filed on or before October 17, 1996, appellant's brief and joint appendix was to be filed on or before October 24, 1996, appellee's brief was to be filed on or before November 25, 1996, and oral argument was to be heard as early as the week of December 16, 1996.
- 5. On November 8, 1996, a Pre-Argument Conference was held before Staff-Counsel Stanley A. Bass.
- 6. By Order dated November 8, 1996 the record on appeal was to be filed on or before December 2, 1996, appellant's brief and joint appendix was to be filed on or before December 16, 1996, and the brief for appellee was to be filed on or before January 27, 1997.
- 7. By Notice of Motion dated December 11, 1996,
 Appellant moved for an extension of time from December 16, 1996
 to January 6, 1997 to file her brief and the record.
- 8. By Order dated December 13, 1996, Appellant's December 11, 1996 motion was granted "with the understanding that no further extensions of time will be requested by appellant herein." Appellant's brief and the Joint Appendix was to be filed by January 6, 1997, and Appellee's brief was to be filed by February 10, 1997.
- 9. By Notice of Motion dated December 19, 1996, Appellant moved to file an oversized brief of an additional twenty-five pages.

- 10. By Order dated January 2, 1997, Appellant's December 19, 1996 motion was granted to the extent that she was to file a brief not exceeding seventy-five pages in length.
- 11. By Notice of Motion dated January 10, 1997,
 Appellant moved for a four-day extension of time, after-the-fact,
 to file her brief and record on appeal on January 10, 1997,
 rather than January 6, 1997.
- 12. By Order dated January 16, 1997, Appellant's January 10, 1997 motion was granted. The time for Appellees to file their brief was re-set to February 18, 1997, and leave given to Appellant to file an over-size brief of seventy-six pages.

WHEREFORE, Appellees request that their time for filing their brief be extended by three weeks, from February 18, 1997 to March 11, 1997.
